- 6 The Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC) is mandated by the Health Research Extension Act
- (HREA) of 1985 and the Animal Welfare Act. 7

## **Policy Statement** 8

- Before any animals are used, the IACUC must evaluate for compliance with federal law and university policy all 9
- 10 activities conducted by faculty, staff, or students involving the use of vertebrate animals. The review process is
- intended to ensure that animals will be housed in an approved animal facility, appropriate plans are made to 11
- relieve pain, the method of euthanasia is acceptable, personnel involved in the care and/or use of the animals 12
- 13 have training, veterinary care will be provided and non-animal alternatives have been considered.
- 14
- 15 The IACUC must be informed if experimental procedures or personnel involved in a previously approved
- protocol are changed. IACUC approval must be renewed annually for ongoing projects. 16 17
- 18 Use of vertebrate animals for teaching must be approved by the IACUC prior to the use of live animals in a
- course. IACUC approval must be renewed annually. Instructors must be familiar with the "Guidelines for the 19
- 20 Use of Vertebrate Animals in Teaching."
