4 Introduction

- 5 The purpose of the policy is to ensure that the appropriate dean and the senior vice president and
- 6 provost, or the appropriate vice president, and Capital Projects Advisory Committee (CPAC) are
- 7 supportive of the proposed project before detailed planning with Facilities Planning and Management
- 8 (FP&M) is begun or funding feasibility studies are initiated with the ISU Foundation.
- 9 Facilities planning and fundraising resources will not be committed until this authorization has been
- 10 completed and the CPAC has reviewed the preliminary information. This authorization will assure the
- potential projects are based upon realistic assumptions and have some possibility of funding prior to
- 12 committing significant planning resources.

13 Policy Statement

- 14 The CPAC provides oversight of significant capital projects. Part of that oversight is to approve
- requests to pursue planning for capital projects that are expected to exceed \$250,000, involve
- 16 fundraising to complete them, and/or are perceived to be unusual in terms of potential campus or
- public interest in them. In order to be sure that institutional priorities are met and the scope of the
- 18 proposed projects are coordinated before information is presented outside the university, the Internal
- 19 Capital Planning Process must be followed (see Resources below).
- 20 Development of significant capital projects may occur following concept approval by the CPAC.
- 21 Preliminary approval helps to ensure the efficient use of planning and fundraising resources.
