## 4 Introduction

- 5 Locking out machinery and equipment prior to servicing or maintenance is an essential element of
- 6 protecting employees from the unexpected start up or release of stored energy. To address this
- 7 issue, and to comply with the Occupational Safety and Health Administration's (OSHA)
- 8 Lockout/Tagout (LOTO) Standard, Environmental Health and Safety (EH&S) has developed LOTO
- 9 policies and procedures. This information is listed in the ISU Lockout/Tagout Manual. EH&S
- 10 periodically offers LOTO training

## 11 Policy Statement

- 12 Each department is responsible for evaluating areas under its administrative control to determine
- 13 whether there are processes or equipment where the LOTO program would apply. Departments that
- 14 find LOTO requirements applicable are responsible for the adoption and implementation of the
- 15 provisions of the Iowa State University LOTO program. Departments are also responsible for
- 16 providing employees who perform service and maintenance duties with the proper equipment and
- 17 training to implement the LOTO programs that are necessary to control hazardous energies.
- 18 Employees are responsible for observing all practices and procedures contained in the Iowa State
- 19 University Lockout/Tagout program and other general safety practices, attending designated training
- 20 sessions, and reporting hazardous or unsafe conditions to their supervisors or EH&S.
