4 Introduction

- 5 This policy identifies expectations of university personnel for compliance with law related to workplace
- 6 injury or illness.

Policy Statement

- 8 Workers' compensation is a part of the Iowa Code designed to provide certain considerations to
- 9 employees who sustain injuries, occupational illnesses or occupational hearing loss in the course of
- and arising out of their employment. Benefits are administered according to lowa law.
- All accidents, injuries, illnesses, and hearing loss occurring at work or in the course of employment
- must be reported to the supervisor, even if no medical attention is required. Employees should notify
- their departmental supervisor who will call lowa State University's approved medical provider to
- schedule an appointment, unless emergency care is required. Employees who choose to be treated
- 15 by any other treatment center and/or physician may not qualify for any workers compensation
- insurance benefits and may also be responsible for all medical costs related to the incident. This is in
- 17 accordance with workers' compensation benefits for state employees.
- 18 The employee or supervisor is responsible for completing the First Report of Injury form and
- 19 submitting the form within 24 hours. Incidents that are not reported may cause employees to be
- 20 ineligible for future benefits related to this injury or illness. An employee cannot receive reimbursement
- 21 for medical expenses for both Worker's Compensation and a group medical plan.
- 22 An injury or illness is considered work-related for Occupational Safety and Health Administration
- 23 (OSHA) reporting purposes if an event or exposure in the work environment caused or contributed to
- 24 a condition or significantly aggravated a pre-existing condition. This includes injuries while the
- employee is on break, in the restroom, traveling on business or engaged in work activities such as
- training required by the employer. Hospitalization or death of an employee must be reported within 8
- 27 hours, as required by OSHA.
