### 5 Introduction

6 Facilities Planning and Management is charged with providing the university community with a safe,

7 comfortable, and usable physical environment. This includes ensuring that modifications to that

8 environment comply with all applicable building codes, state and local regulations, Board of Regents

9 policies, and university standards.

## 10 Policy Statement

All physical modifications to university facilities, interior and exterior, must be approved by Facilities

- 12 Planning and Management. This includes, but is not limited to, new construction, remodeling of
- interior spaces, installation of equipment that requires permanent attachment or connection to
- building utilities, attachment of items to exterior of buildings, modifications to the grounds of campus,
- and installation of items on the grounds of campus. Facilities Planning and Management will

determine, after consultation with the requester and appropriate university officials, the most

17 appropriate methods of implementing said modifications.

18 Requests to pursue planning for capital projects that are expected to exceed \$250,000, are highly

- visible, include external stakeholders, impact other administrative units, or involve real estate
- 20 purchases and/or leases must be submitted to the Capital Projects Advisory Committee (CPAC) for
- 21 review and approval.
- The procurement of architectural services, engineering services, construction managers and any
- specialized consultants related to the planning, design and construction of University facilities are to
  be coordinated by Facilities Planning and Management.
